

Anthology's Global Warming Quilt

Quilt Size: 80" x 80"

Block Size: 8" x 8" finished

8.5' x 8.5" unfinished

Blocks: 100 - 4 x 4 Patch

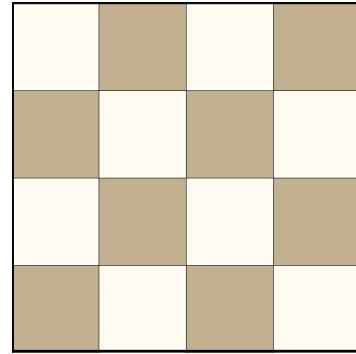
Fabric: Anthology Batik Strips

100: 2.5" x 42"

****Strips may vary in width. You can deal with it!**

Sort: Sort the fabric strips into sets of 2 ea. (50)

Matching colors or not.



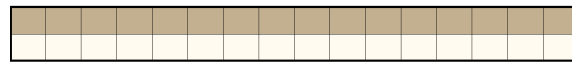
4 X 4 Patch : Make 100: 50 sets of 2 ea

Sew: Sew the sets of 2 together along the 42 inch side. (50)



Press: Press the seam to darker fabric. (50)

Cut: Cut each strip set into 16: 2.5" x 4.5"
You should have 50 sets of 16.



Sewing: Take one set of 16

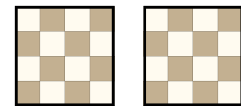
Sew 2.5' x 4.5 sets together to make 8: 4 Patches.



Now sew 4: 4 Patches together to make 2: 4 x 4 Patches

Continue sewing until you have : 2: 4 x 4 Patches per color sets

(50 x 2= 100: 8.5" x 8.5" blocks)



Press the quilt blocks: Alternating seam when possible.

Example Only suggested

Designing the quilt top: Lay out the 10 blocks by 10 blocks

(100: 8.5" x 8.5") Light colors in one corner and follow diagonal to opposite corner with Dark blocks. This will give high contrast to the quilt when you cut the 4 sections for the circle.

(L: light; M: Medium; D: Dark ** M: Medium Center)

Sewing the 4 sections of Quilt Top:

Sew 4 sets of: 5 blocks x 5 blocks.

Creating 4 sections: LABEL as follows:

Upper Left (UL), Lower Left (LL), Upper Right (UR) and Lower Right (LR). Put a chalk mark to indicate

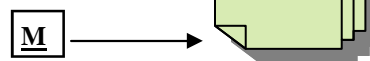
The center corner of each section: see(M)

Cutting the Circle:

Preparation: You may stack the 4 sections, with Right Sides Facing UP and the M's touching. Pin (together), the 4 sections around the outer edges.

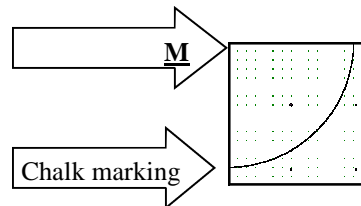
(Try to match seams) **Pretty Important** take the time to do this step.



Marking: The Pinned Sections: Once again, Make sure the **M's** are touching.

Grab a Yardstick and a piece of Chalk. Place the Yardstick on the point indicated by the **M**, and place the other end along one edge. (a distance of 36" for the arc)

Start marking (with the chalk) a curved line (arc) the full width or the section.



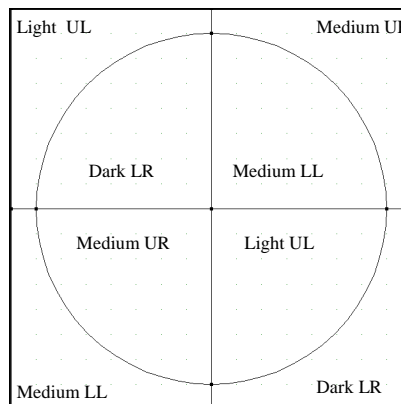
Cutting: Now here is where you have to trust yourself.

Note: Seam allowances are there. The bias cut really will become your friend. Make sure the center seams (perpendicular and horizontal center seams **MATCH**. The "eye" will align the other seams.

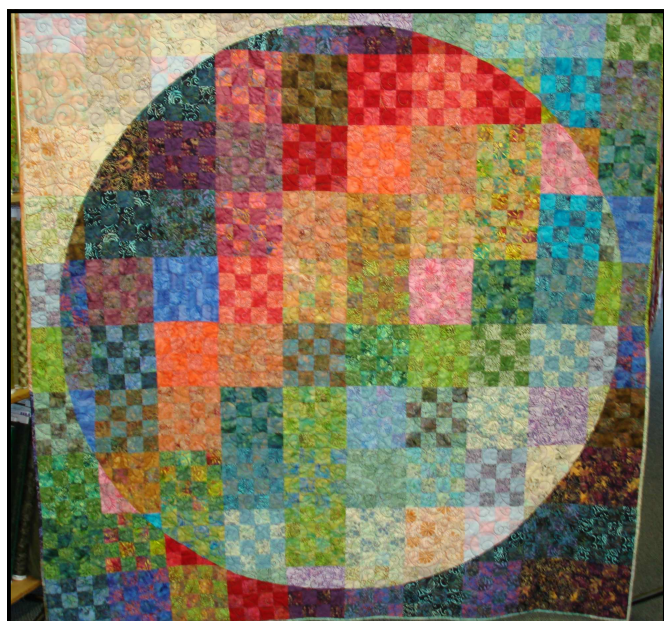
The Cut: Scissors or Rotary cut along the chalk line. You will have 4 corner pieces and 4 pie pieces. Place the pieces as indicated below.

Drunkards Path Quilt Blocks: Make 4

Sew the 4 section (Pie shape into "L" shape)
Seams will match at the straight edges but as you continue around the arc, seams will not quite match. **THIS IS OK!!** The "eye" will make it fit.
Pin the arc and Sew with a 1/4" in seam allowance.



The Quilt: Sew the 4 Drunkard Path Quilt Blocks together to make the quilt. Approximate size 80" x 80" give or take.
